



BUILDINGS IN THE ACLAND TOWN AREA

A number of Acland houses and buildings have been donated and relocated to charity or community organisations in the Toowoomba district.

The Acland Hall will be maintained in a sound working order for use by New Acland as a training, meeting or visitors greeting venue.

Upgrades will be considered for future amenity enhancements (i.e. to facilitate meetings and logistical requirements for large groups, etc.).

The main Acland school building will remain in situ, for future operational use by New Acland and/or the Acland Pastoral Company. Associated school structures will be disposed of and removed from the site, either via sale, donation or demolition.

The school signage will either be retained at the site, or alternatively donated to the Jondaryan Woolshed or a similar local historical organisation.

The miner's cottage at 18 Bellevue Street will remain in situ and will be appropriately maintained.

Buildings not being retained for further use have now been demolished.

All building materials containing asbestos have been appropriately removed and disposed of by a licensed asbestos removal contractor (i.e. in buildings for both demolition or retention). All building slabs no longer required, have been removed and disposed of as per regulatory requirements (except for structures to be retained).

Most vacant blocks will be incorporated into a 'treed parkland', to improve the safety, accessibility and visual amenity of the Acland town area.

All sites (i.e. sites that formerly contained buildings and those retaining buildings) will be appropriately maintained by the New Hope Group, including mowing and management of weed and pest species.
